If you believe you have complied with the statutory requirements but your application was denied, you may use this form to appeal and provide documentation of why you believe GBC's decision is incorrect. Appeals submitted without documentation will not be considered. GBC's Nevada Promise Applicants may appeal for the following reasons:

- Technical issues with the Nevada Promise Scholarship application process (provide proof of submission)
- Validation of first mandatory training: By March 1 (provide proof of attendance)
- Validation of attendance to a mentoring session (provide proof of attendance)
- Submission and/or approval of community service hours due June 1 (provide proof of submission and/or approval by community service agency)
- Completion of FAFSA by March 1 (provide proof of FAFSA submission)
- Submission of required Financial Aid documentation by June 1 (provide proof of submission)

If you are appealing due to not meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) You must include why you didn't meet SAP and what you will change to ensure you meet the requirements. If you had extenuating circumstances, please provide documentation.
